

What is Gender?

Gender refers to an internal sense of self as male, female, both, or neither (gender identity), as well as one's outward presentation and behaviors (gender expression).

Gender assigned at birth

A person's gender is typically assigned at birth based on their biological and physical features; such as external and internal genitalia and sex chromosomes.



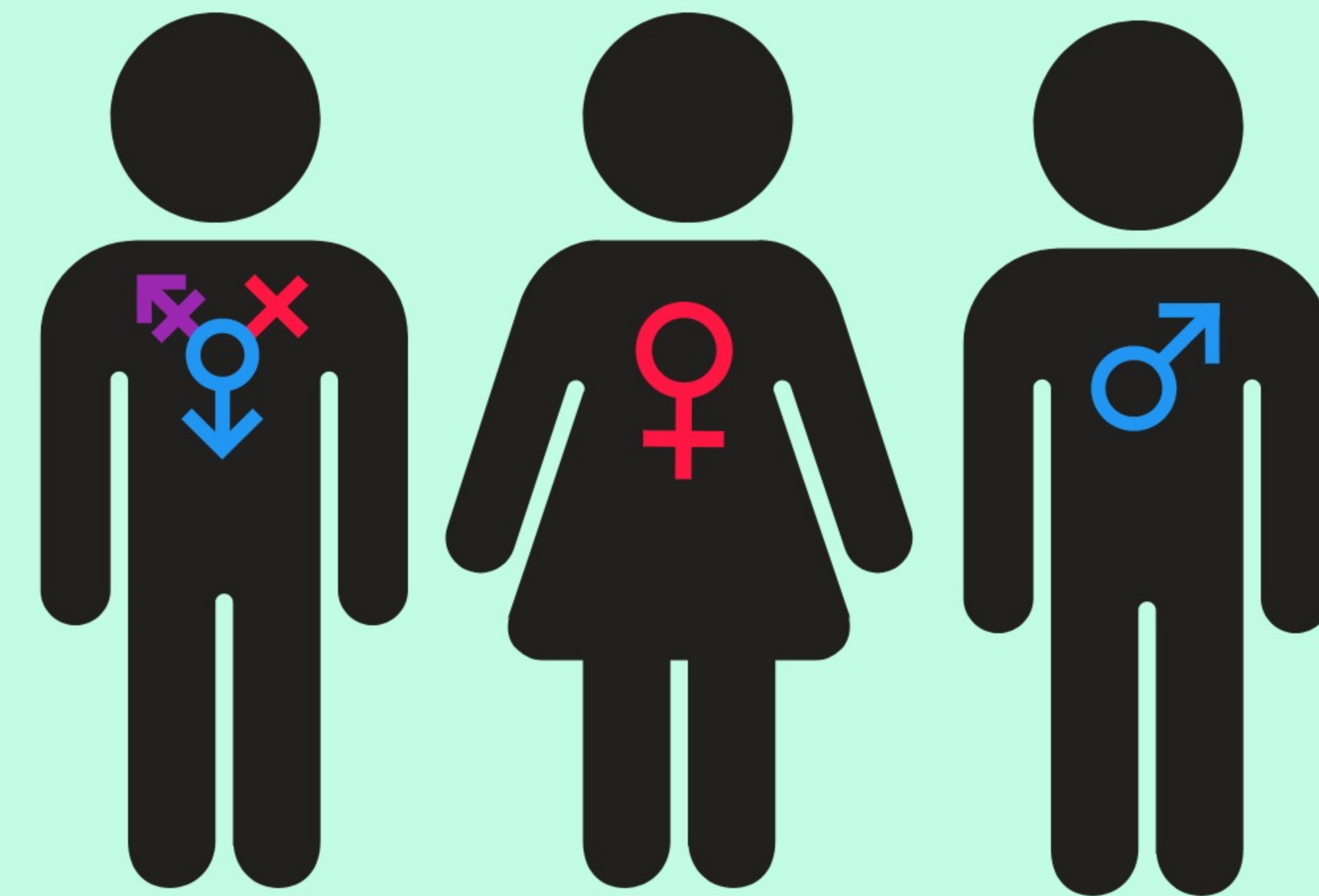
Gender Identity

Gender identity is how you feel. It is an internal, deeply felt sense of being male, female, a blend of both or neither. One's gender identity can be the same as or different from their sex assigned at birth.



Gender Expression

A person expresses their gender through outward presentation and behavior. This includes: a person's name, clothing, hairstyle, body language, and mannerisms.



Gender Roles

Gender roles are a set of societal norms dictating the types of behaviors which are generally considered acceptable, appropriate, or desirable for people based on their actual or perceived gender.
